<p>Images & Files</p> 	<p>A picture, including alternate text: <code>[[Image:Wiki.png The logo for this Wiki]]</code>. You can put the image in a frame with a caption: <code>[[Image:Wiki.png frame The logo for this Wiki]]</code></p> <p>If you are adding an image from another site, just put the URL of the site without any brackets: http://www.ala.org/pic.jpg.</p> <p>Upload the file using the upload file link, then make the link to the file like this: <code>[http://your_wiki_url./index.php/Image:TheFileTitle]</code></p>	<p>A picture, including alternate text (image is at left to save space). You can put the image in a frame with a caption (<i>not shown, but see previous column for how to format</i>).</p> <p>If you are adding an image from another site, just put the URL of the site without any brackets (<i>not shown, but see the previous column for how to format</i>).</p>
